"Good Cops" tell their stories Monday on Ch. 15

WMTV profiles Wisconsin's 'Good Cops'

Stories of local law enforcement officers can be seen on "Good Cops," on WMTV (Ch. 15) during the 6 p.m. newscast each Monday during November.

Each week, the series focuses on a different police officer in Wisconsin who has gone beyond the call of duty. The series began Oct. 25 by recognizing Officer Kathleen Hansen of the Lake Mills Police Department. She is a single mother of six who at age 38 decided to become a police officer. Hansen patrols the city and takes time to volunteer extra hours to help the community.

Officers Christopher Lemke and Jeffrey Dodge from the Baraboo Police Department are profiled this week. During the Baraboo flooding in July, the officers saved the life of a person caught in flood waters.

Officer Scott McElroy and Sergeant Arthur Phillips of Evansville will be recognized Nov. 8. The officers are responsible for saving two youngsters from carbon monoxide poisoning.

Officer Darlene Kemmerer, a member of the Madison Police Department, was assigned as the first neighborhood foot patrol officer for South Madison. Kemmerer has worked to empower residents to protect their neighborhood. Her story is told Nov. 15.

Officer Wian Taber, an 18-year veteran of the Beaver Dam Police Department, rescued a 2-year-old boy from a vehicle that had rolled into a lake.

He is profiled Nov. 22.

Chief Mark Mueller of the Montello Police Department will be profiled Nov. 29. He was nominated by Sheriff Steve Sell of Marquette County, who says Mueller, "actively supports any program that will help local children."
