Elizabeth Fisher, a writer and editor who in 1969 founded *Aphra*, a former feminist literary magazine, died last Friday at her studio in Sag Harbor, L.I. Miss Fisher, who also had a residence in Manhattan, was 57 years old.

Her body was found by the Sag Harbor police.

The cause of death is being investigated by the Suffolk County Medical Examiner's Office.

Miss Fisher was the author of "Sexual Evolution and the Shaping of Society," which was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in 1979. She attended Smith College, and in the 1950's worked in Rome as a cultural columnist for *The Rome American*.

She is survived by her husband, Angelo Savelli; a daughter, Ellen Herold Streeter; her parents, Max and Evelyn Friedman, and a grandson.
